

15-30 min walk from the Kita-Senri station.


大阪モノレール 阪大病院前駅下車徒歩5分～15分

1. Tsurumi Ryokuchi Park,

This Park was opening as a regional park in 1972. It became the venue of the "International Garden and Greenery Exposition" in 1990



2. Creative Centre Osaka

Creative Centre OSAKA, that is located in the mouth of Kizu-river, was established to regenerate the former Namura Dockyard.



3. J-GREEN Sakai

J-GREEN Sakai, that was sports facility, reused the former ironwork site to promote sports and the recreational activity including soccer.
